salmon. There is no one who knows it all. A lot of us who have fished the Islands for years know a small piece of the puzzle. For example: Larry Carpenter from Master Marine knows the outside of San Juan Island better than anyone I know. I have a customer named "Clint" who knows Smith Island better than anyone that I know. I feel that I have mastered fishing the Rosario Straights area. Then there is Point Lawrence, Cattle Point, Pea Vine Pass, Humphrey Head and Lovers Rock. That's just a few of the places. My good friend Richard Bailey knows Middle Bank better than anyone that I know. The list is so long. How do you make a choice?

There is never guarantee that you will catch derby winning Chinook by following the rules. What I will guarantee you is this: you most likely will not catch anything if you fish any of the spots that I mentioned if you fish any of these spots on the wrong tide.

Where do we start? Here is a partial list of places to fish and on what tide.

Cypress/Eagle Bluff/Incoming tide

East Lopez/Lopez Flats/Outgoing Tide

Blakely/Thatcher Pass/Outgoing Tide

Orcas/Point Lawrence/Outgoing Tide

Middle Bank/Small Outgoing Tide Smith Island/Any Tide

Cypress/Tide Point/Outgoing Tide E a g l e Point/San Juan Island/Outgoing

I want to emphasize how important it is to stay put when you are fishing the Islands. Develop a game plan and stick to it. I see anglers all the time fish an area for an hour pull their gear in and leave, just to see the bite come on an hour later. They most likely would have participated in the action if they just left their gear in the water. I can't tell how important this is. Be patient or risk going home empty handed. If you like instant gratification, the San Juan Islands is not the place to be searching for it. Be patient! Let the fish come to you.

Example: I like fishing Thatcher Pass when the tide is going out. The place I like to fish is closer to Pointer Island (page 66 of my most recent book). The fish can bite at the beginning of the tide, the middle of the tide or at the end of the tide. But never all three or a combination of the three. But, the bite will happen sometime during the tide. Many times I have started fishing at the beginning of the outgoing tide and never got a bite, not a nibble until the water started slowing down towards the end of the tide. If I had left, I would have risked missing the bite. I am not making a case for going to Thatcher, what I am saying; fish the tide in one spot. Don't be lured into moving because some salmon angler in another boat caught a fish some other place. If you do move, it is highly likely that you are going to miss the bite by the time you get to the new place. Be patient! Let the fish come to you.

Let me tell you something really cool that you can do, because I have done it many times. You can fish Lopez Flats or Thatcher Pass on the outgoing tide and maybe pick up a fish. Don't continue fishing either spot as the tide transitions to start coming back in. Maybe 15 minutes after tide is all

the way low and the water barely starts to reverse. Pull your gear up and head to Tide Point/Eagle Bluff/
Just as the tide starts to come in, I like to start fishing at tide Point and troll to Eagle Bluff. You have to do this on time and exactly as I have stated. This is what I meant earlier by stating; you have to be in position at different stages of the tide. You don't just go to these places and fish, you have to be in key spots at different stages of the tide.

Once the tide starts running hard between Tide Point and Eagle Bluff you keep fishing closer to Eagle Bluff. By the middle of the incoming tide, you never want to fish any closer than half way back to Tide Point. You might think that I am making this far too complicated than fishing has to be. I am not. The guys who are winning these derby's know what position to be in all the time. They probably know three or four spots really well and they can fish those spots very effectively.

Another good strategy if you do not want to move around to much. Fish between Strawberry Island and Tide Point. Many big salmon are taken out of this area. This is one of those areas that everyone forgets about, then someone takes a limit of derby winning Chinook out of here. Then it gains back it's popularity. *Tide Point Map Click Here*

I mentioned Middle Bank. Middle Bank is an excellent place to fish for Chinook in March and April. It is one of the best. However, you cannot fish effectively here unless there is less than six feet of tidal movement. This makes the number of times you can go to

Middle Bank a pretty narrow choice. When the tide is right, you will catch salmon there. Fish Middle Bank only when the tide is going out and fish only on the most northern tip of the Bank in 9-100 feet of water. *Middle Bank Map Click Here*

A great place to catch extra large Chinook is at Point Lawrence. I don't especially like fishing here, but it is a top producer. The water runs so hard that it makes fishing difficult. Don't let me sway your decision for going or not going to Point Lawrence, because I will guarantee that some of the top ten fish in the Anacortes Derby will come from this spot. There are two ways to fish Point Lawrence. 1) You can troll the big rip line than forms off the Point. 2) You can troll back in to the corner (Sea Acres). I have always chosen to troll back in to the corner to get out of the strong tide that runs off the Point. Point Lawrence Map Click Here

In Marine Areas 6, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 10, 11 and 12: crabbing opens on July 1 at 7AM. Crabbing is open Wednesday through Saturday. These Areas stay open through September 6. Open Wednesday through Saturday.

Marine Area 7: is divided up into three Areas. Marine Area 7 South and East, opens for crab on July 14, at 7AM. This Area stays open through September 30. Open Wednesday through Saturday.

Marine Area 7 North: opens for crab August 14, at 7AM. This Area stays opens through September 30. Open Wednesday through Saturday.
